**Human Development** is an interdisciplinary field of academic study which has grown out of more traditional disciplines such as anthropology, biology, linguistics, psychology, and sociology. Students majoring in Human Development explore people's lives from conception and birth through old age and death. In their study of physical growth and change and the development of consciousness, knowledge, and relationships, they increase their understanding of themselves as well as others in various social groups, cultures, and historical periods.

The program fosters mutual learning and dialogue among students and faculty, and utilizes state of the art instructional technologies and friendly educational format and scheduling to make the program accessible to all students with diverse needs and backgrounds.

Human Development majors pursuing an Early Childhood Development Option will focus more on development from birth to age 5, preparing themselves as future academics, practitioners, social activists, social workers, teachers and leaders in Early Childhood Development.

### SCHEDULING

The Human Development program is available evenings only and through audio streaming. Courses are scheduled to allow a student to complete the upper division portion of the Human Development major with an Early Childhood Development Option in a two year period.

### APPLICATION

The Concord Campus operates on the quarter system with four quarters a year. Applications are accepted every quarter. Applicants who want to enroll at the Concord Campus must be eligible for admission as an upper division student. Upper division and graduate courses only are offered at the Concord Campus.
